

## St. Ambrose Housing Aid Center Impact Report - Fiscal Year 2024

St. Ambrose Housing Aid Center, Inc. (St. Ambrose) is a 501 (c)(3) non-profit organization guided by the mission to create and maintain equal housing opportunities for low–and moderate-income people, primarily in Baltimore City, and to encourage and support strong and diverse neighborhoods.

Founded in 1968 to confront the pervasive discriminatory practices that harmed BIPOC homebuyers, St. Ambrose continues today as a Black-led organization, led by a Board and powered by a staff reflective of the Baltimore region. Over the past 56 years, the organization has strengthened and expanded a holistic, multi-pronged approach to affordable housing that is rooted in the pursuit of social, economic, and racial justice.



St. Ambrose's five interconnected service areas provide a pathway home and springboard to a better life for thousands in the Baltimore region by increasing the supply of affordable rental opportunities, reducing barriers to homeownership, bolstering home asset protection and intergenerational wealth transfer, and increasing the supply and availability of affordable homes in targeted Baltimore neighborhoods.
